Basketball Remains Popular with Young People Source: EB

In the latest Active People Survey figures released June 13 by Sport England, basketball has recorded a promising six months, proving especially popular with under 25 year olds. Over the past six months there has been an 18,600 increase in the number of 16-25 year olds playing basketball regularly each week taking the overall figure for that age group to 127,800.

With 14-15 year olds accounting for 27% of all participants aged 14+ and 16-19 year olds accounting for a further 34% it is young people who are really driving the popularity of the sport.

This increase in participation mirrors the trends for sport in general across the country. The Active People Survey results show that the number of over 16s playing sport once a week, every week has risen to over 15.6 million, an increase of 180,000 in the last six months and 1.7 million more than 2005 when London won the bid to host the Olympic Games.

Minister for Sport, Helen Grant, said: "It's really encouraging that there are more people getting out there and playing sport than ever before, with 15.6 million participating regularly every week. I am pleased that many team sports are getting their numbers up."

For basketball, the increase in young people getting on court has been accompanied by a continued increase in BME participation, an increase in organised participation such as those players who are members of a club, receiving coaching or playing in a competition and a slight dip in the number of 26+ year olds playing the sport regularly.

YBL Web Site is a Big Hit

We have our news section, information about memberships, league tables and our constitution is there.

You can also click on a club name to get all their information, like their home court and coaches names!
