It was a nurturing and supportive environment where I had a lot of fun, laughed a lot, learned a lot and developed as a table official.

I also met a fantastic group of people, table officials, referees and tutors all with a love of basketball

I went to Polly Camp as a Level 2 table official, having mainly done local league games and the occasional NBL game. Heft having sat my Level 3 exam, tabled several GB Masters games, been observed during games by the tutors and been given some 'SMART' feedback to go back with so that I could get my qualification signed off.

Yes, the camp is hard work, not only is there classroom work but I did study on an evening so that I was happy with my level of knowledge prior to sitting the Level 3 examination.

The tutors are all welcoming and really approachable. I enjoyed the lessons especially ones where we reviewed and discussed actual game footage which I felt improved my knowledge greatly.

Thad the chance to do the shot clock, initially supported by a tutor then on my own.

Most table officials work at the same club, with the same officials and this camp takes you out of your comfort zone and pushes you to be a better table official.

You don't have to worry about food, that's all sorted and you all stay in a hotel nearby. All the officials have a course meal on the Saturday night as well so you can relax and let your hair down (just a little).

So if you are a Level 2 and you are looking to get your Level 3 or if you are a Level 3 and want some more game experience this camp will get you there.
